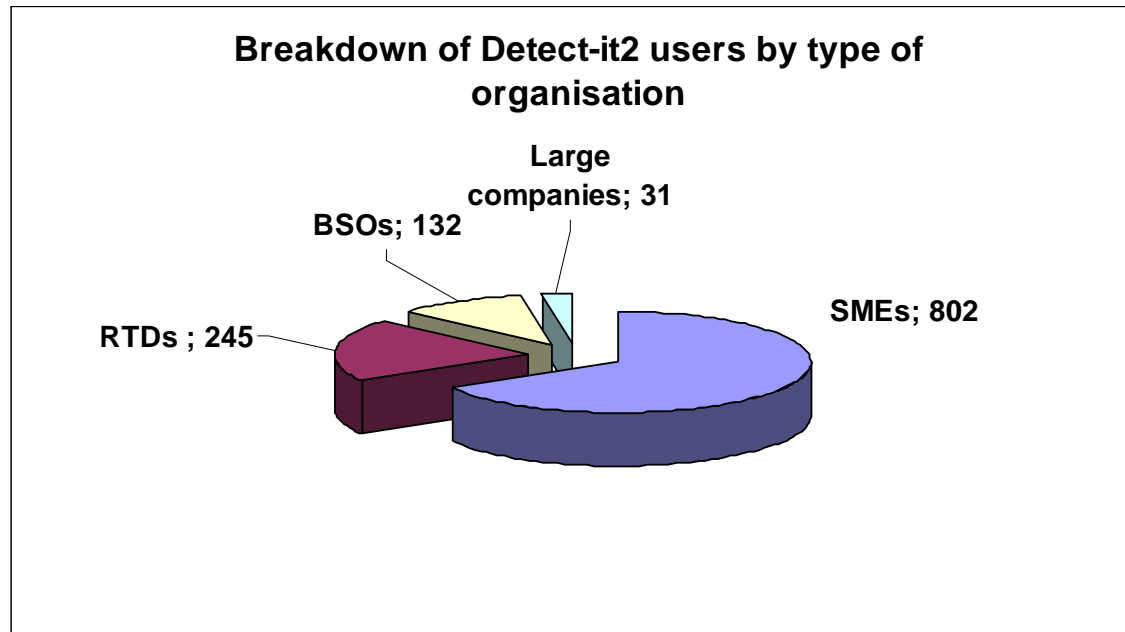

DETECT-IT 2 RESULTS – THE FIGURES TO KEEP IN MIND

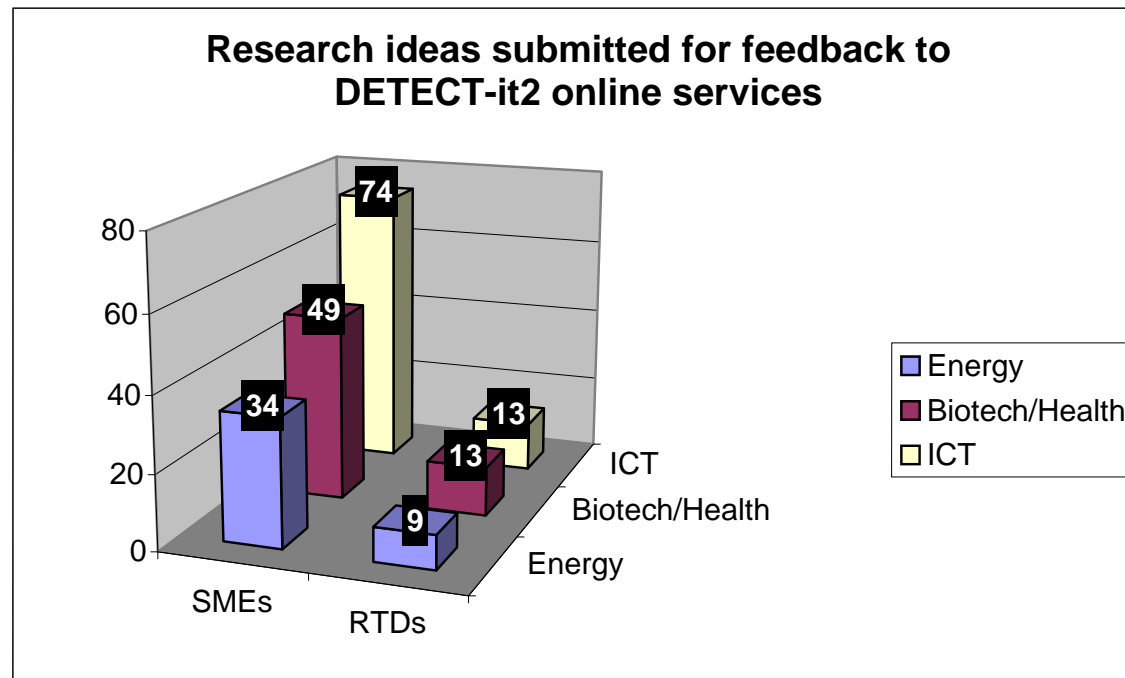
The present document aims to present the overall results of the Detect-it 2 project which run from the 1st of January 2006 until the 30th of June 2008. You will find below tables and graphs presenting the most relevant outcomes of the project.

1. The graph below shows the breakdown by type of organisations in the Detect-it 2 on-line database in M30.

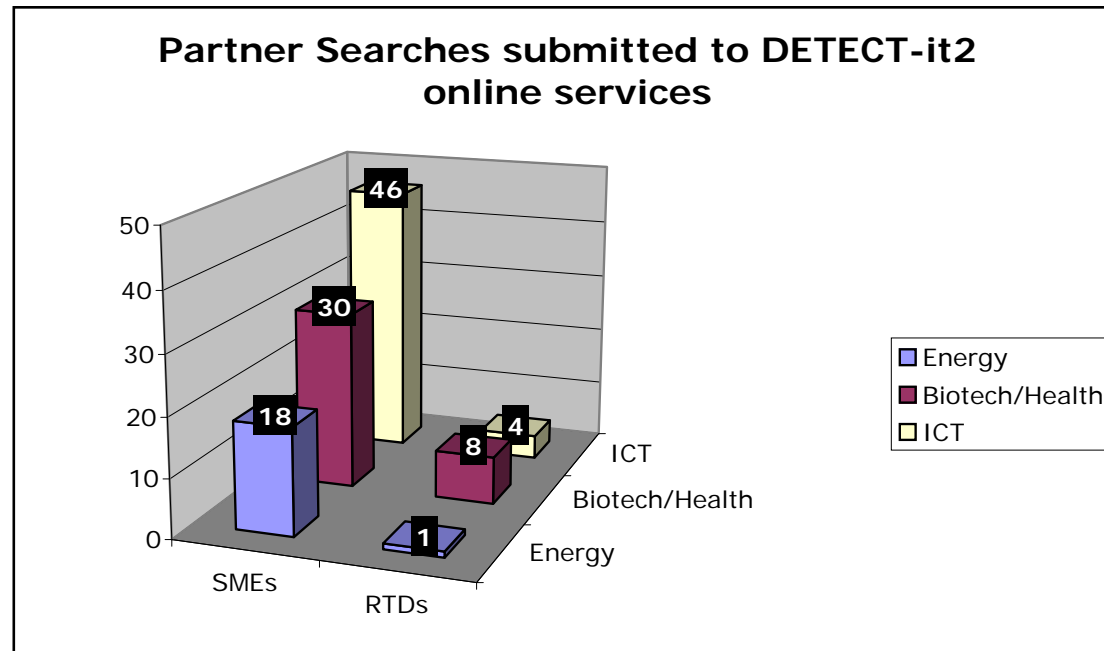


2. The DETECT-it2 project has invested in providing its users not only with an online partner matching platform but more uniquely a system for feedback for their FP7 related ideas. The “ideas for feedback service” is a free service which has been provided by the DETECT-it2 ETI and which is not offered in this format by any other ETI.

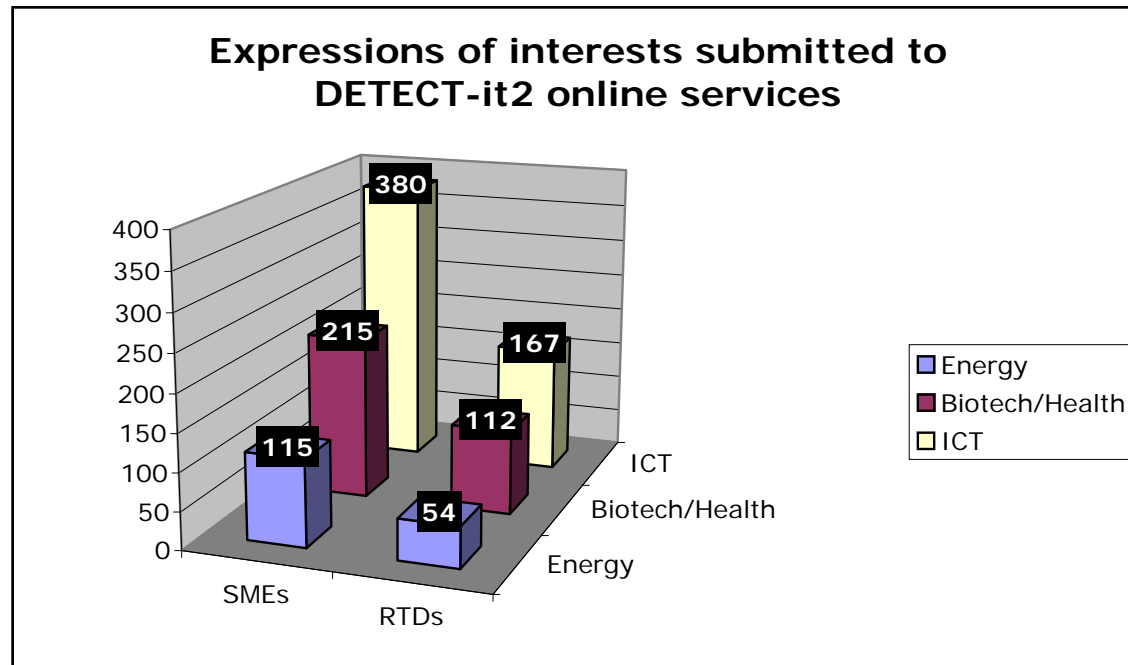
2.1. At the end of the project, the distribution of a total of 192 bottom up ideas for feedback per sector and per organisation were to be represented as follows:



2.2. Through out the whole DETECT-it2 project, 55,7% of all the 192 ideas submitted online for feedback were converted into Partner Searches. The vast majority of the 107 partner searches submitted, i.e. 87,8% were submitted by SMEs, the RTDs submitted 12,2% of all partner searches.



2.3. The 107 partners searches posted on the DETECT-it2 website received 1043 expressions of interests. Out of these, 68,1% were submitted by SMEs and 31,9% by RTDs. This clearly shows both the interest and value of the SME partners searches to RTD players. From an SME perspective, the response from RTD performers enables them to widen their network of contacts in this community throughout Europe.



3. In terms of SME involvement in FP7 proposals, the tables below present the results in general as well as in each of the 3 sectors, i.e. energy, health/food and ICT.
